The primary purpose of this trip is to speak at the Clean Coal Day 2019 International Symposium in Tokyo. This is an important opportunity to promote Australia's credentials as a key partner to one of our largest resources and energy customers and important investors.

Coal production and exports remain vital to Australia's economy and power generation capacity, especially in regional New South Wales and Queensland. Low emission fossil fuel technologies, such as clean coal and carbon capture and storage (CCS), can contribute to a secure and affordable supply of energy, while delivering on Australia's emissions reduction targets.

While in Japan, I plan to meet with my ministerial counterpart – the Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry – as well as with key Japanese industry stakeholders, to promote our coal sector and the investment opportunities.

I am writing to seek your approval for the Hon Stuart Robert MP, Minister for the National Disability Insurance Scheme and Minister for Government Services to travel to the United States of America for the period 30 October 2019 to 9 November 2019. Dear Mr Kunkel,

I am writing to seek your approval for a Ministerial delegation to travel to California, Washington D.C. and Florida, United States of America, from 3-11 November 2019 (inclusive). I propose that I, one adviser, and an Australian Government official from the Department of Home Affairs, accompany the Minister.

As you know the 2019-20 summer season has the potential to be catastrophic, particularly for bushfire. The Minister wants to ensure that Australian emergency services have all the information to hand to be prepared for this risk. Therefore, the visit will draw upon lessons learnt by the United States in how they responded to, and recovered from, recent large-scale bushfires and hurricane events.

This trip will be a unique opportunity to advance Australia's preparedness for severe to catastrophic disasters as the proposed one-week program covers a range of matters relating to emergency management and drought, including the Californian Fires of 2018, Hurricane Dorian 2019, and water policy and resources.

The Minister proposes that the key outcomes of the trip be presented to the Ministerial Council of Police and Emergency Management meeting on 20 November 2019. At that meeting, he intends to host a ministerial roundtable to ensure Australia's preparedness posture for the coming season is of the high quality Australian's expect.

I confirm that this travel does not coincide with Parliamentary sittings and on approval, the Minister will seek further approval for appropriate acting arrangements to be in place during the travel period.

I seek your approval to travel to Davos-Klosters, Switzerland from 19-26 January 2020 to participate in the World Economic Forum (WEF) Annual Meeting.

My attendance at the WEF Annual Meeting provides an important opportunity to showcase Australia's vision for boosting competitiveness in the age of the Fourth Industrial Revolution as well as initiatives that we are taking to promote innovation and women's empowerment across the wider Asia-Pacific region. The President of WEF wrote to me in August 2019 inviting me to participate in their Annual Meeting to share my insights on these matters.

The Australian Government is committed to supporting our core and emerging manufacturing industries to maximise the benefits of Industry 4.0 with the aim of growing businesses, creating highly skilled jobs and strengthening participation in global supply chains. Collaboration between countries on this important policy issue is essential for Australia, to ensure our manufacturing industries can take full advantage of the opportunities for job creation and economic growth offered by the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

This meeting is timely, given I plan to host the ASEAN Women in Innovation Leadership Dialogue as part of the WEF Annual ASEAN Meeting in Jakarta, Indonesia in July 2020. Women remain underrepresented in the global and regional workforce, especially in the sectors that will underpin the Fourth Industrial Revolution. The Dialogue, which I announced in September last year, will begin an important conversation between Australia and Southeast Asia about how we can work together to promote women in innovation leadership and fully unlock our region's economic potential. The WEF Secretariat has advised that Indonesia's President has indicated his support for the Dialogue at the WEF ASEAN Meeting, under the theme of human capital in the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

The WEF Annual Meeting in January will complement the themes of the Dialogue, with its focus on the transformation of industries to achieve more sustainable and inclusive business models. My attendance will help to catalyse international discussion ahead of the Dialogue and highlight ways in which governments and industry can collaborate to better support our human capital and deliver sustainable benefits for our economies and societies across the region.

This visit will contribute to the Government's key priorities around the global science, technology and innovation agenda and provide useful insights on implications for Australia. It also aligns with the Ministerial Travel Priorities Plan by pursuing Australian interests at the WEF, a priority international forum.

The proposed travel follows the Government's value for money principles and the most cost effective arrangements have been put in place in accordance with the *Guidelines on Overseas Visits* by Ministers. The draft program, flights and indicative costs are enclosed for your consideration.

While I am overseas I will ask my colleague, Senator the Hon Matthew Canavan, Minister for Resources and Northern Australia, to act as Minister for Industry, Science and Technology.

Dear Prime Minister,

I am writing to seek your approval to travel to Sri Lanka from Saturday 14 March 2020 to Friday 20 March 2020 (inclusive). I propose that a senior advisor accompany me on this trip, as well as the Group Manager of Customs Group in the Australian Border Force and a representative from International Policy Division in the Department of Home Affairs.

This visit will be built on the goodwill generated during the visit by the Minister for Home Affairs from 3-5 June 2019 in the wake of the Easter terror attacks in April 2019. Australia's response to the attacks, both in the initial phases and over the longer term, present a further opportunity to cement our relationship with Sri Lanka, a key strategic bilateral partner in the Indo-Pacific region.

Dr Bradley Armstrong PSM (Group Manager of Customs from Border Force), will accompany me, as a significant part of the visit will involve Border Force and Customs related discussions. High level meetings will be held with the intention of developing customs to customs relationship with

- My Customs Counterpart in Sri Lanka
- Head of Sri Lankan customs
- Visiting the New Port City Under Construction in Colombo
- Modern Slavery exchanging Australia's views on the approach to modern slavery. Intend on meeting with organizations such as the IOM.
- Human Trafficking Highlighting the Australian's approach stressing the importance of working together to combat this menace
- Intended Meeting with the Director Board of Sri Lankan airlines particularly since there is a direct flight from Colombo to Melbourne daily and there is cargo that comes from Colombo on a daily basis.
- Gathering of the local large to medium business community

I also plan to meet with Ministers and senior government officials holding overlapping interests with my Ministerial responsibilities, including in the areas of customs, tourism, endangered wildlife, multicultural affairs, immigration and trade and investment. It is proposed to seek a meeting with the President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, who was elected in November 2019 and the Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa. This will represent an early opportunity for a member of the Australian Government to meet with them and reiterate the importance of our close relationship.


Sri Lankan customs has just implemented an E-Permitting system for endangered wildlife in association with CITES (the convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora). It is considered to be one of the best systems in the world. (Sri Lanka is the first country in the world to implement this). I intend on having a look at this system in operation in Sri Lanka as I have had discussions and a round table with Minister Susan Ley on the implementation of such a system in Australia. I will also be visiting the Airport Cargo Storage facilities to have a look at their systems for identifying the export of illegal wildlife.

Within my multicultural portfolio the Sri Lankan community is one of the largest communities particularly in Victoria. The community has constantly stressed the importance of a visit to Sri Lanka. As the Assistant Minister for Multicultural Affairs I have established a strong affiliation with the local Sri Lankan community and the visit will be extremely well received. It will also have a significant media interest in the Australian Sri Lankan multicultural media and the wider national media in Sri Lanka.

I plan to visit the churches that were targeted in April 2019, and meet with Cardinal Malcolm Ranjith, head of the Catholic Church in Sri Lanka, and hold a roundtable with key representatives from all faith communities in Colombo. This is an issue very close to the heart of our local Sri Lankan community in Australia and it certainly will highlight to them the importance that the Australian government places on the tragic terrorist attacks that Sri Lanka experienced. As I also have the remit for the 'Safer Communities Grant' and many of the Catholic Churches in Sri Lanka were attacked by terrorist in 2019, this will allow me to gain further perspective on this very important matter.

In addition to meetings in Colombo, I intend to visit Kandy in central Sri Lanka. In Kandy I would visit the historic Buddhist temple Sri Dalada Maligawa (Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic of the Buddha) and meet with key Buddhist leaders. I also propose to visit Jaffna in northern Sri Lanka to observe the work being conducted by Home Affairs funded projects supporting the return of refugees from India. Jaffna is home to a large Sri Lankan Tamil community, a community that is an integral part of our Australian multicultural community. Within my multicultural portfolio I am closely associated with Hindu Tamil organizations and temples and this will certainly provide me with opportunity to meet some of the leaders in the area and our local Tamil community will certainly appreciate this significantly.

Minister Dutton's office has been advised of the intended travel. I confirm this travel does not coincide with Parliamentary sittings and I will advise of acting arrangements in due course. In order to mitigate costs associated with this trip, logistical support for the travel will be provided by locally engaged Home Affairs employees in Sri Lanka.

I seek the Prime Minister's approval for the Assistant Minister for Superannuation, Financial Services and Financial Technology to travel to Washington DC, New York and London from 14 April to 25 April 2020. Following referral of an invitation to the Treasurer, the Assistant Minister proposes to lead a delegation of leadership figures from Australia's superannuation industry to two symposiums on retirement savings policy issues in Washington DC and New York. In London, at the invitation of the UK Government and the Lord Mayor of London, the Assistant Minister will attend events forming part of UK FinTech Week and host bilaterals with fintech industry leaders.

The superannuation events in Washington and New York will provide a timely opportunity to deepen links between leading Australian superannuation funds and American retirement savings product providers, Congressional leaders and leading policy thinktanks. Interest in maintaining the sustainability of the US social security system over the coming decades has increased the appetite among both US policy makers and industry leaders to explore reform options and has generated interest among our US counterparts in the Australian solution of a retirement savings system based on privately-held personal accounts. Accordingly, now is a particularly opportune time to share Australia's experience in building its \$3 trillion superannuation industry.

While in New York, the Assistant Minister will also host a lunch reception for Australian fintech entrepreneurs building businesses in the US, hold bilateral meetings with finance industry executives considering opportunities to build their business in Australia, and explore avenues for increased cooperation, bilateral investment and services exports for the broader Australian financial services sector.

Fintech events in the UK will provide opportunities for the Assistant Minister to engage with policy makers, regulators and businesses in one of the leading financial technology ecosystems. The UK Innovate Finance Global Summit will include a speaking opportunity and will be attended by 2500 delegates and 300 fintechs. Additional engagements proposed for the UK include attending and speaking at the Australia Investment Day hosted by the Lord Mayor of London, addressing the Australia-United Kingdom Chamber of Commerce, and bilateral meetings with the Assistant Minister's UK counterpart, the Economic Secretary to the Treasury, and the UK implementation trustee for open banking, Mr Imran Gulamhuseinwala. These engagements, along with other bilateral and roundtable fintech events, will provide the basis for the Assistant Minister to further extend and strengthen the UK-Australia FinTech Bridge. The visit will also help identify export opportunities for the Australian financial services sector.

In addition, while in London, the Assistant Minister plans to meet with the former UK Minister for Civil Society, Mr Nick Hurd (who drove the establishment of the UK Government's flagship impact investment vehicle, Big Society Capital) and with other leaders in the UK impact investment sector, to explore opportunities to adapt these ideas to an Australian context.

The Assistant Minister proposes to be absent from Australia from Tuesday 14 April until Saturday 25 April.

Noting the proximity in timing to ANZAC Day, Australia's High Commissioner to the United Kingdom, the Hon George Brandis QC (who has been actively involved in the program planning of the fintech related events in London) has invited the Assistant Minister to consider representing the Australian Government at ANZAC Day commemorations in London. At this stage, we have not extended the proposed itinerary to include this, but if the Prime Minister desired the Assistant Minister represent the Australian Government on ANZAC Day in London, the Assistant Minister would be pleased to oblige.

The total estimated cost of the trip is \$48,054. Airfares are estimated to cost approximately \$24,708 while accommodation, on the ground transport and daily allowances are expected to be around \$21,180. A further breakdown of these costs is provided in **Attachment A**. It is proposed that the Assistant Minister be accompanied by \$22(1)(a)(ii) Chief of Staff. The most cost effective arrangements have been sought for this trip, however, please note that these are indicative costs and are subject to change.

Attachment B provides a draft of the Assistant Minister's program while in New York, Washington and London. Our office would be pleased to provide you with a more detailed version closer to the anticipated travel date.

I am writing to seek the Prime Minister's approval for the Minister for Defence Industry, the Hon Melissa Price MP, to travel to the United States in April 2020. The purpose of this visit is to continue to advocate for and grow Australia's defence industry. The Minister would do this by leading a delegation of Australian companies to the Sea-Air-Space tradeshow and by further meeting with US officials in Washington DC. The Minister would depart Australia on Thursday, 2 April and return on Friday, 10 April. This travel was originally identified in a letter to your office dated 30 August 2019 as part of the combined Defence portfolio's proposed ministerial overseas travel for FY19/20.

Firstly, the Minister would partake in a tour of Austal's USA Shipyard in Mobile, Alabama. As you would be aware, the Australian company, Austal, has a large shipyard in Alabama where it is manufacturing the Littoral Combat Ships for the US Navy. A visit to Austal's facility would provide an opportunity for the Minister to represent the Australian Government for the official Keel Laying Ceremony for the future US Navy ship *U.S.S. Canberra*.

The Minister would then travel to Washington DC to lead a delegation of representatives from Australia's defence industry. The key event is the Sea-Air-Space Exposition in Maryland where the Minister would lead over 30 Australian defence industry companies as part of the Team Defence Australia showcase. This would provide another opportunity to promote Australian businesses in the United States.

This visit follows the Minister's previous travel to the US on 29 September to 7 October 2019 where she advocated for further opportunities for Australian businesses in the F-35 supply chain after Turkey's suspension from the program. Throughout this proposed trip the Minister would meet with US officials and companies to check on the progress of Australian company integration into the broader US defence supply chain. The Minister would also hold discussions with Australia's new US Ambassador, HE Arthur Sinodinos to discuss the bilateral importance of Australia's defence industry with the US.

It is proposed that the Minister be accompanied by Mr Douglas Ridd, Senior Adviser to the Minister for Defence Industry and Flight Lieutenant Dr Alexander Barbaro, Aide-de-Camp to the Minister for Defence Industry. The Minister would also be accompanied by a senior official from the Department of Defence. The senior official's and Flight Lieutenant 22(1)(a)(ii) expenses would be covered by the Department.

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I can confirm that the most cost effective arrangements have been sought for the proposed travel. An itinerary, cost estimates and draft program for the proposed travel are attached.

Subject to their availability, I would propose that Ministers Reynolds or Minister Chester would act as Minister for Defence Industry during the period of the Minister's absence.

I would be grateful if you could obtain the Prime Minister's agreement to the proposed travel as set out above.

I seek your approval to travel to the United States from 29 March to 5 April 2020 to participate in the 36th Space Symposium, reaffirming Australia's commitment to growing the Australian space sector, and engaging with leading technology companies on using technology safely and increasing investment in Australian technology sector.

The Space Symposium, in Colorado Springs, will bring together space leaders from around the world to discuss, address and plan for the future of space. The Symposium will welcome more than 14,000 people from around the world, including speakers, attendees, exhibitors, volunteers, educators and students. It has become widely known as the premier US space policy and program forum and as the "must attend" opportunity for information on and interaction among all sectors of space.

My attendance at the Space Symposium will provide an opportunity to have high level discussions with key stakeholders to reaffirm Australia's commitment to growing the Australian space industry, particularly with the A\$150 million investment targeted at integrating Australian businesses into international supply chains.
