Hi Andrew,

I've pulled together a few points ahead of meeting with DITRDC on the Road Safety project today.

We are seeking:

- Agreement from DITRDC to work closely with our team to develop the DSA by mid-Feb 2022, based on the proposed schedule of work in Table 1 (we will circulate to DITRDC after the meeting)
- Agreement from DITRDC to engage their legal team before Christmas, so we can work closely with them from January




Hi s 22(1)(a)(ii), thanks for the update on ONDC's DSA templates.
